1 Timothy 2

■ 1 Tim 2:1-15

1 I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone

2 for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.

3 This is good, and pleases God our Savior,

4 who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

5 For there is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus,

6 who gave himself as a ransom for all men-- the testimony given in its proper time.

7 And for this purpose I was appointed a herald and an apostle-- I am telling the truth, I am not lying-- and a teacher of the true faith to the Gentiles.

8 I want men everywhere to lift up holy hands in prayer, without anger or disputing.

9 I also want women to dress modestly, with decency and propriety, not with braided hair or gold or pearls or expensive clothes, 10but with good deeds, appropriate for women who profess to worship God.

11A woman should learn in quietness and full submission.

12I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man; she must be silent.

13 For Adam was formed first, then Eve.

14 And Adam was not the one deceived; it was the woman who was deceived and became a sinner.

15 But women will be saved through childbearing-- if they continue in faith, love and holiness with propriety.

■ requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving

- *Deeset*, It basically carries the idea of desire or need. All true prayer begins with a sense of need and desire.
- *Proseuche* It is used for public or private prayer
- *Enteuxis* In the sense of “conversation” and then “petition.”
- *Euchaistia* Where we get “Eucharist”

■ 1 Tim 6:6-8

6 But godliness with contentment is great gain.

7 For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it.

8 But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that.

■ Ps 121:1-8

1 I lift up my eyes to the hills--

2 My help comes from the LORD,
the Maker of heaven and earth.

3 He will not let your foot slip-- he
who watches over you will not
slumber;

4 indeed, he who watches over

day, nor the moon by night.

7 The LORD will keep you from all
harm-- he will watch over your life;

4 Every man who prays or prophesies with his head covered dishonors his head.

5 And every woman who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head-- it is just as though her head were shaved.

■ Rom 16:1-15

1 I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a servant of the church in Cenchrea.

2 I ask you to receive her in the Lord in a way worthy of the saints and to give her any help she may need from you, for she has been a great help to many people, including me.

3 Greet Priscilla and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus.

4 They risked their lives for me. Not only I but all the churches of the Gentiles are grateful to them.

5 Greet also the church that meets at their house. Greet my dear friend Epenetus, who was the first convert to Christ in the province of Asia.

6 Greet Mary, who worked very hard for you.

7 Greet Andronicus and Junias, my relatives who have been in prison with me. They are outstanding among the apostles, and they were in Christ before I was.
